A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

With the coming of Lent, this will be our last 'Green' Sunday of Ordinary Time till the July 4th weekend! Isn't that crazy?! We'll return to Ordinary Time, after the Easter Season, in early-June, but with a succession of special Feasts and Solemnities on those first several Sundays after the Easter Season, we won't have an 'ordinary' Sunday till July. Buckle up, we begin the great adventure of Lent & Easter this week with Ash Wednesday!

I laid out some guidance, last week, on approaching your Lenten Fast. You still have a few days, yet, before Lent, so discern how you would like to fast and ease into it the best you can. In addition to fasting, I would encourage you to add something into your life that will benefit you, help you grow closer to God, and avail you to the best opportunities to receive the Graces of the Season our Lord wishes to offer you. This could be reading from and praying a daily devotional (I will have available the Magnificat daily devotional as well as the 'Little Black Book' available for you, too). This could also be a daily chaplet / rosary, another spiritual book to read (this is truly limitless! If you want some advice, I'd say, "Jesus of Nazareth, Vol. 2: From the Entrance into Jerusalem to the Resurrection" by Pope Benedict; or, "The Screwtape Letters" by CS Lewis. In the spirit of breaking the fourth wall, I will be re-reading both of those this Lent.), a book or a portion of the Bible (The four Passion Narratives, the Book of Psalms, Jonah, Job, Ecclesiastes, or Sirach are just a few that come to mind that may be rewarding), a spiritual podcast (Getting started or getting caught up with either the Bible or Catechism or Rosary in a Year podcasts are all great ideas), or simply an additional amount of time set aside each day for prayer – something that is reasonable and that you will be able to maintain.

Whatever it is use choose to fast from and to take on, please choose what 1) The Lord is calling you or leading you to do, and 2) something you will be able to stay with and complete. It makes absolutely zero sense to just be holier than thou and gargantuan in taking on a whole retinue of things that are only done out of their extremity and rooted in nothing The Father or The Son were leading you into and are only there to make your life miserable with how much you're failing at it all...please, let go of all nonsensical ideas of Lent! Go to God, discern, and let Him lead you to simply do what will foster that relationship with The Trinity. The only reason we take on any of these things is not to impress God or pass the test – there is no test to pass! We take these on because we desire a deepening in how we come to know, and see, and experience the living God. Period. The whole and entire Trinity pines for us - it's why we exist and why we are preparing for the great rescue mission of God to win us back! His love has already been 'earned' by nature of us being created. Don't create an obstacle or test that isn't there. Everything we take on in Lent, and in the Spiritual Life, is at service and response to that Love that you and I did not earn nor merit but was afforded to us at the moment of our creation and solidified in a tremendous way at Easter. So, choose your Lent alongside God, not apart from God, and choose your Lent to help you grow closer to Him.
