### A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

The above reflects the financials for the first half of the parish fiscal year. I think you're used to these by now, so there is not much to explain in terms of how to interpret the numbers. Just one quick note. The roof cost \$133k. \$33k of that came out of operating (that is the majority of that \$54k in the Maintenance line), the remaining \$100k was taken from savings. The speakers were paid for and money set aside back in June with 'last year's dollars' so they did not impact this year's cash flow. Outside of that, it has been a strong fiscal year! Thanks!!

The Christmas Season takes its final turn and begins to hurl down the liturgical straightaway this weekend with the celebration of Epiphany! For centuries – and still is most of the world – Epiphany was always celebrated on January 6. The Twelve Days of Christmas isn't just a silly carol but was an homage to the twelve days of celebration. The twelfth night was the Eve of Epiphany, and the next day would be Epiphany. Because of how the calendar works, January 6 could be any day of the week. In the US, amid the reforms of the Liturgy and the Liturgical Calendar in the 1970's, the US Bishops fixed Epiphany on the first Sunday after January 1 (The Octave Day of Christmas, Mary Mother of God). This is why you may hear Epiphany being associated with January 6, but we are celebrating it on the weekend of January 4-5. Elsewhere in the world - even the Vatican! - the lion's share of Catholics, I think all Orthodox, and liturgical Protestants celebrate Epiphany on January 6. For them, this weekend is, I think, just 'Second Sunday after Christmas'. It's wild to think that there is a liturgy that exists that I will never celebrate and most of us will never partake of! One of the endearing hallmarks of the Catholic Church is Her Universality! It's sort of bewildering, and admittedly frustrating, when there is an exception to the rule that is as big as the US itself! I understand, though, the desire behind this exception to the rule here in the US. The fact is, if we celebrated Epiphany on a Monday (as it would be this year) so few would be able to celebrate it. That is the idea with moving feast days and holy days of obligation around, as we tend to do in the US. It is all in an effort to help the faithful be faithful to the Church and Her Feasts and Solemnities. I think in this case, it is more important that the Church – the faithful – are faithful to celebrating the Epiphany and it's richness and depth, rather than waiting another 24-48 hours just to do it on January 6. Universality is intrinsic to our faith and the character of our Church, but ideology can't get in the way of saving souls! If the Bishops felt and feel that keeping Epiphany fixed on this Sunday after Jan 1, then I'm all for it! At the end of the day, the Church exists to heal and save sin sick souls and bring God's sons and daughters back home to Him. Canon 1752 beautifully captures this with the phrase "salus animarum suprema lex", that is, "The Salvation of Souls is the Supreme Law of the Church". Nothing else is quite salvific as the Liturgy, itself. And since salvation of souls is supreme over a date, the Church looks out for Her sons and daughters by moving the date for us. It is good that we get to celebrate the divine and sacred Mysteries of this Feast as a family! Happy Epiphany!
