A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

This past week was Catholic Schools Week. Ever since my first day of Kindergarten in August 1991 at Sacred Heart School in Erie, I have never not been uninvolved with Catholic Education – either as a student, parish priest, or pastor! I don't know myself apart from having some relationship to Catholic Schools – it's imbued into my identity, and my entire discernment, formation, and living the priesthood has also happened and existed within the confines of Catholic Education. This is why I think about, and often talk about, our schools being like the Eighth Sacrament. It's a metaphor - I know they are not theologically the same – but like the other Seven, they, too, reveal outwardly inward Grace. The Grace of God offered in our schools is unique and something the Church needs to commit Herself to safeguarding and advancing. Trust me, it ain't easy, but every sacrifice is worth it, so long as we keep the aim and purpose in mind: avail our children to the opportunity to experience the Grace of God, daily, in a setting of education where He can be made manifest in all subjects and every conversation! I would posit that is the beauty and brilliance and the character of our schools that I love so much. It doesn't come down to competition. I have NEVER in my years of pastoring our schools saw myself in competition with the public schools. Simply, what they offer is great and the majority of our people go through them – there is nothing evil about them. Our Catholic schools simply offer a different 'product', if you will. The Public Schools will always have access to more money, have bigger sports programs, more extracurriculars, etc...let's not pretend that's not the reality. But, they are not St Michael School. They are not offering the same experience and encounter with God. Period. It is simply a different experience and opportunity we offer. Parents get to decide where is best for their children, based on any number of reasons! I have never thought less of a parent who chooses to not send their children to our schools because as parents, they get to decide what they feel is best for their children, and I honor those choices. Like I said, if it's a war over 'the better sports team' or 'who has the coolest stuff', then who cares, and honestly, we are going to lose almost every time. But, if the mission of the Church is simply to offer something unique all unto itself and doesn't feel it needs to be at war...if the school can just confidently speak to its mission and purpose and what it offers, regardless of what any public school is doing... then our mission will be fruitful!

The mission of the Church is the Salvation of Souls, period. It is not to compete with school districts or whatever - that is just a distraction. The Church is confident in Her ministries and Sacraments (7 +1!). If a parent wishes to send to the public school, great, that is their right as parents. The Church will be here to offer Faith Formation on weekends, of course weekly Liturgy and Sacraments, and every other facet of the community to help raise their children in the faith. For those who choose Catholic Education, awesome! We offer a great ministry of that here, and we would anticipate and expect those families to also take full advantage of all other ministries and facets of the parish community and Church - not the least being Liturgy and the Sacraments.

So, my approach is, and always has been, that Catholic Education is a powerful and incredible ministry the Church offers to any student and family who wishes to 'do education' within a unique and Grace-filled experience. We are not competing - a competition we'll lose and that will only lead to running after the wrong things - but simply offering the opportunity for something different! The Church isn't meant to, nor is She ever effective, when trying to compete with every shiny thing in the world. Christ does not compete. Christ offers something new, something different, something not of this world! May that be how we engage the world with all our ministries and efforts in which we engage in when serving our singular mission: Salvation of Souls!
