# A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

For four bulletin articles over the coming weeks until the Election on November 5, I will do my best to present some of the incredibly complex yet beautifully expansive theology of Catholic Social Teaching to help give us some resource for our prayerful approach to Election Day. The contemplation of how to engage an election for anything, but certainly for the leader of our nation, ought to be done under the weight of the Cross and in the solitude of the Desert. A Catholic does not let media, ads, etc. rule their consciences or think for them. A Catholic carries his Cross out into the Desert to be with The Lord as he contemplates The Gospel and the ideals of society set forth for us by Christ, and taught through the holy teachings of The Fathers, the Saints, and the Magisterium throughout the last two thousand years. The Catholic cannot look to corporate media conglomerates, but Christ. Any decision made apart from the Cross and Desert, from the Gospel and the Magisterium, is a foolish decision.

Firstly, we need to all be on the same page about a few items. Neither candidate: Mr. Trump nor Mrs. Harris *deserves* your vote or is *better* than the other. We are not choosing the most moral candidate or the best person. They are both sinners; they both fall short of the Christian ideal; neither are the obvious Catholic vote or whatever other title or label one may attach to them. I think this is a first principle that so many miss and get caught up in and what causes such a ridiculous amount of contention among Catholics over elections and voting! Mr. Trump nor Mrs. Harris in any way are the embodiment of Christ's Gospel and Catholic Theology that seeks to put The Gospel into practice. So, wipe that from your mind and that framing from the conversation. A failure to do so only idolizes a candidate and allows one to ignore or dismiss meaningful considerations. Failure to do so is essentially idolatry.

It is also imperative that we be on the same page with the realization that we do not live in *the* system or society that is imagined in Catholic Theology nor the Scriptures. Our two parties are incredibly flawed and fall immeasurably short of the ideal set forth for us by Christ and that has been handed down to us by The Magisterium. A refusal to acknowledge this is another reason there is so much emotion and anger among Catholics over elections. We can't pretend we are living in the ideal. The problem with our politics, our systems, our society is *not* merely the other party - it is *both* parties! It's the entire system! Again, failure to see that only emboldens this deliberate falling short of the glory of God and of the Gospel. I hope to give just a little glimpse into this over these coming weeks. Indeed, Christ came, and the Church exists, in part, to facilitate a kind of revolution of the City of Man into the City of God! The Church envisions a radical revolution where every aspect of society and the politics of that society are governed by The Gospel because citizens know and love the Gospel! We are so far from this and no, neither party is closer than the other. That is yet another erroneous idea that only intensifies the idolization and blinds so many well-meaning Catholic voters.

Mr. Trump. Mrs. Harris. The Republicans. The Democrats. None of them *deserve* your vote nor your relentless admiration and obedience. The Church has an idea of a society and of the political person that our present reality leaves us impoverished of. So any authentic discussion and discernment of voting in this election needs to be rooted in the principle of the brokenness of man - and of society - and with an earnest desire to make parties and societies and political persons aligned with what Christ has handed on so that the brokenness can be redeemed by Christ through, yes the Sacraments and Grace, but also through the politics and characteristics of our society.

So, if you and I are in agreement that neither candidate is the 'Catholic Candidate', that neither are 'deserving' of my vote, that neither candidate nor party exhibits or exemplifies the fullness of the ideals set forth by Christ and His Bride, and if we can agree that there are just heaps of meaningless noise over all this and that Truth is only found under the weight of the Cross and the solitude of the Desert...then and only then can you and I or anyone have a Catholic conversation over what it means for a Catholic to vote. Over the coming weeks I'll briefly highlight just four principes the Magisterium teaches that I feel are most relevant to this conversation and for your time in the Desert with The Cross contemplating your vote. It won't be exhaustive, but a glimpse into what our hearts and minds need to be wrestling with.
