HAZERDOUS CONDITIONS

The continuous hazardous winter weather has prompted a review of use of parking lots for Daily Mass and activities throughout the week. Effective immediately, the south lot will be closed during the week whenever there is snow or freezing rain. This move will reduce salt use and plowing for the safety of everyone. Salt is becoming harder to find as the winter continues. Both lots will be open for weekend Masses.

The north lot is more level and the sidewalk feeds into the parking lot unlike the south lot. If the orange cones are blocking the entrance to the parking lot, do not move the cones or go around them to enter the lot.

Please try to be aware of plowing in process when you are arriving for Mass. While every attempt to have the lots plowed and salted before anyone arrives, snow and icy conditions have developed close to Mass times. Avoid parking in the area of the lot that is not plowed if space permits.

A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

You should have received in the mail this past week a letter about the 2025 CSA and informational materials about it. You will also see an insert in this weekend's bulletin highlighting key information about the annual drive. Before we move on to the 2025 drive, I want to acknowledge and thank those who contributed to the 2024 drive! We had a 100% success rate with the drive! We were able to give to the Diocese their portion and were able to maintain and keep within the parish roughly \$35,000! That money went towards subsidizing the school as well as providing cash flow for our various projects, like the new sound system and roof! Every dollar that was pledged came in! This was my twelfth CSA as a priest, and I don't think I ever had a drive that was so exact as in every dollar pledged was paid. Thank you to all who participated and generously gave to the workings and ministries of the Diocese, at large, and to our parish's operations and ministries! You are an amazingly generous parish, and it is an honor to steward your treasures for the good of the Church. This is why I try my hardest – maybe too hard – to be as transparent and illustrative as possible when it comes to our finances. I reject with every fiber and mitochondria of my being the idea of keeping things secret and creating a smokescreen around finances. That is why I give you those quarterly reports, and why I never talk about raising money or giving money or trying to be cute by quoting scripture to frame an ask for money! I will never be that priest, and it is a hill I'm willing to die on! The only time I'll 'ask' is the annual CSA drive – for it is my responsibility as pastor – but beyond that, it is my vocation to cooperate with Grace and The Father in stewarding and shepherding a vibrant parish where Jesus is the center and the definition of all we do, and allow you to discern how you wish to support it or not support it. I'm not a fundraiser, I am a pastor, and I recoil when I see priests playing that role. It's simply lame, cringe, and inspires no one to give their life to The Gospel! Ok, my rant is over! Thank you again for all you do for our parish!

Looking to the 2025 drive, Diocesan Goal / assessment is \$80,604. This is a slight uptick from last year's number as the calculation has changed in how they derive the number. The reason for that was that the assessment is derived from a formula that looks at an average of the last three years of income. With so much parish restructuring over the last few years, the former formula created an imbalance to some parishes for numbers had become skewed with parishes merging and closing. So, the finance office of the diocese changed a few variables to smooth out peaks and recalibrate things. It is important to note that the overall goal has not changed, though. The diocese, to their credit, has been very diligent to not raise the overall goal of the drive, though costs have obviously increased, they are determined to not pass those costs on to us. The overall goal remains \$4.235M, as it has been for about five years. I think that is to be commended.

With all that being said, though, I am not ready to lay out the goals for what I'd like to do with the excess that stays in the parish. I'm still working on a few things that I would like that money to go to, but I'm not ready to lay it all out yet. Give me a week or two and I'll lay out this year's official plan. We still have a few weeks till the drive officially begins, so in the meantime please discern what you may wish to do this year. Remember, the drive runs through the entirety of the year, so it's not an upfront commitment. And in a week or two, I will lay out what our plan is with the money that remains here.
