HAZERDOUS CONDITIONS

The continuous hazardous winter weather has prompted a review of use of parking lots for Daily Mass and activities throughout the week. The **south** lot will be closed during the week whenever there is snow or freezing rain. This move will reduce salt use and plowing for the safety of everyone. Salt is becoming harder to find as the winter continues. Both lots will be open for weekend Masses.

Please try to be aware of plowing in process when you are arriving for Mass. While every attempt to have the lots plowed and salted before anyone arrives, snow and icy conditions have developed close to Mass times. Avoid parking in the area of the lot that is not plowed if space permits.

A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

This will (unfortunately) be our final full week of Ordinary Time before we are thrusted into Lent on Ash Wednesday, March 5! Most are probably still recouping from paying off their Christmas credit card bills, and here we are moving into Lent. As per usual, I will be having daily Confessions offered throughout the Season. We will begin our Lenten Confessions the first full week of Lent, **Monday March 10**, and continue through Wednesday April 23 (Holy Week). The Lenten Confession Schedule will be:

Mondays 4:30 – 6:00 PM (*April 14 6:30 – 7:30PM due to Chrism Mass*) Tuesdays 11:30AM – 12:30PM Wednesdays 8:00 – 9:00 PM Thursdays 9:30 – 10:45 AM Fridays 11:00 AM – 12:00 PM Saturdays 3:00 – 4:00 PM (both Fr Ray and I)

The only request I make is to please take advantage of the *entire* Season. This is 5 ½ weeks of Confessions offered daily (except Sundays). It can create a logjam in those final days if too many wait till the very end! If you need to wait, by all means, your confession will be heard, but I'm just encouraging you to take advantage of those random Tuesdays! Both Fr Ray and I want to not rush you and give you all the time you deserve, so please take advantage of the 33 days and the almost 45 'Confessor man-hours' of Confession offered over the upcoming Season!

As we near Lent, in this final full week, let us utilize these final ten days before the Season to contemplate what we may do to make our Lents fruitful and impactful on our Christian and Spiritual lives. Fasting is something we should all incorporate into our lives within Lent (well, all the time but, we're here focusing on Lent). No matter what it ends up being from which you crave to fast, use these ten days to begin to wean yourself into it. if you have ambitious fasting goals, going cold turkey on Ash Wednesday can feel heroic, but because you are still human, you are most likely setting yourself up for failure and frustration. Don't pretend you are not human or super spiritual and in total control...you aren't! If you want to give up some sweets, cream in your coffee, screen time, doom scrolling, tv or some entertainment, or anything else, just begin to cut back for a couple days so you can slide into Lent with some semblance of control over the fast. My horror story with this was back in Seminary, I went cold turkey with coffee on Ash Wednesday – I was feeling super holy and thought I'd give up coffee for forty days...idiot! I made it through Wednesday, but Thursday morning, I was incredibly irritated! I was in a class (that I already didn't like) and I wanted to crawl out of my skin and find a Starbucks! The professor called on me to answer a question, and the only answer I could muster through my coffee withdrawal was, "shut up!"! Not one of my prouder days! Yes, I had a problem, but my fast was too intense and not something I was going to be able to maintain without interfering with life...and class! Yes, fast from those things that have a hold on your or that will invite some mortification into your day, prepare, though, for it and ease into it. No spiritual practice is perfected on day 1, so set yourself up for some great Graces!
