My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today's Gospel story is a familiar one, not just the story itself but the familiar term of Doubting Thomas. When I think of Thomas and his doubting nick name. Hah, I think to myself, that wouldn't have been me. I don't have to see Jesus to believe.

But then, doubt creeps in and I start to take after my name sake.

When I reflect on it, I feel I should give Doubting Thomas the benefit, of well, the doubt. I've heard my entire life about Jesus and the resurrection, about God made man. Thomas was able to meet Jesus and be with him, but Thomas knew Jesus as a man. Jesus understood he was asking a lot of the apostles. Jesus gently tells Thomas: "Blessed are those who have not seen and believed."

We all doubt. We doubt our own abilities. We doubt our loved ones. We don't feel confident in what we believe. We feel abandoned. We are not sure we are worth much.

The good news: We can believe in Jesus, in the crucifixion and the resurrection. Even if we can't touch the nail marks or the wound in Jesus' side, we can believe in the presence of Jesus in our lives.

And if we believe in that presence, we can erase the doubt about ourselves and others. Today also is the Sunday of Divine Mercy, which is fitting as God's mercy compels us to act, to forgive, to console, to help. Acting with mercy compels us to overcome our doubts about ourselves and about others. We can help. We can contribute. We can see God in others and in our selves.
