A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

With the academic year back underway, it is time to begin Faith Formation (you heard from the Straub's last weekend), get some adult faith formation underway (more on that later), and begin looking towards the Easter Sacraments by getting RCIA back up and going for this year! -It's actually now called OCIA, but since no one would know what that is, I'll stay with RCIA-. Last year, I had such a privileged blast working with Donna, Caylee, and Jim as they prepared to come into the Church at Easter, and I look forward to another great year of that work in preparing people to receive the fullness of God in the Sacraments - it's one of my favorite things I get to do as a priest and pastor! Thus far, I have had one person reach out to me to begin the process, so I formally invite anyone in need of Sacraments: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation, to reach out to me via email so we can begin our work. I plan to formally begin meeting with people come October, so we got about a month to shake the branches and invite people in need of Sacraments or those who have been pondering converting to the Catholic Faith, or even those who may have been raised Catholic but drifted away and are looking to get back into it by catching up on their Sacraments. Another category is the active Catholic who is not Confirmed. There are many practicing adults who are not yet Confirmed for any number of reasons – perhaps most obvious is that they drifted away from the faith before receiving the Sacrament. Whatever category you are in, and whatever the story of what has brought you to this point...I want to walk that with you, learn your story, and help to prepare you for the mind-blowing reality of the Sacramental life of the Church!

As I wrote about last year, and as last year's group will tell you, the primary component of RCIA is not some textbook and class, but The Liturgy - Sunday Mass - and praying with The Scriptures. It makes absolutely zero sense to have an RCIA program where the focus is not weekly Liturgy and going to Sunday Mass! I mean, if someone is not going to go to Mass throughout RCIA, why are they in RCIA...I'm not trying to be smug, but I just have never understood why anything other than that is the primary focus or where energy is exerted. So, to those who wish to go through RCIA this year, and those who wish to finish off their Sacraments, I will not bring you into the Church if you are not living the life of the Church. Again, I'm not trying to be smug or a jerk about it, the Liturgy is everything to us, and to dismiss it or write it off or say 'maybe when I'm Catholic I'll go' is just completely missing the point. And I would put your soul and mine in danger if I ignored that and let the Liturgy become something that wasn't central to each of our lives.

So, anyone never Baptized and would like to receive Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, reach out to me. Anyone Baptized as a non-Catholic and would like to become a Catholic through Eucharist and Confirmation, reach out to me. Anyone Baptized a Catholic but has not received either Eucharist or Confirmation and would like to complete their full initiation into the Church, reach out to me. Anyone who finds themselves in some other scenario, please reach out to me! The best way to contact me is always email – it's as good as texting. The address is always on the front of the bulletin.

This weekend is the kickoff for Faith Formation, I look forward to seeing all our families and students back! If you have not registered yet – especially those who are Confirmed and in High School who will be meeting with me, since that was a last-minute addition to the plan – please make contact with either The Straub's or Jaime Knicely in the Faith Formation Office or talk to them this weekend.
